

Night – The exploration and interpretation of theme.

Image Presentation

There are two main questions that have coloured our reading of Elie Wiesel's Night. This project is designed to help us consider them.

- What were Wiesel's intentions for writing the book, and was he effective?
- What do we, as readers, gain from reading the book, and how does Wiesel help us to gain it?

Theme:

There were several themes we looked at as we read the book. The impact of the holocaust specifically, or hatred in general was seen in many ways. These include, but are not limited to:

- Dehumanization
- Family (Father/Son)
- Spirituality or Faith
- Endurance or Hope
- Survival
- Doubt
- Night-Darkness

STEPS:

- THINK!!! Pick one or two themes you find to be most significant. Think about different ways each theme was expressed, treated **developed** etc. You want to be able to talk about why the theme is important to you, how it made you feel, what Wiesel meant for you to gain from exploring it with him, or **how and why it may have changed throughout the course of the book. How is it relevant today?** Once you have selected your themes and reflected upon them, Find 2 different passages from the text that show how and what you think about the theme(s). These quotes will be used as titles for your image(s).
- Next, select or **produce** an image that relates to the passages selected, and to the aspect of the theme you wish to represent. Try to incorporate symbolic representations, artistic techniques and/or photography techniques. See link...[photography basics](#)
- Prepare to present your images and your thinking to the class. (see attached)

There are three main points you need to cover and talk about for your image:

- Explain how your image treats the theme you chose. Explain the symbolism, imagery, production elements etc. that represent the theme to you.
- Explain how the image addresses the theme within the book. Specific scenes or passages in the book should be linked to the image and explained vis a vis the theme.
- How does the image work with the theme, in terms of a **contemporary connection**. Global issues, events, or phenomena that are tied to the theme in the book as depicted by the image should be explained. Think: why does this matter today? Be specific!!!!

Night - Themes

1. Night is a complex little piece that touches upon and revisits many several themes beyond the holocaust as a specific subject. Discuss with your group and write down as many themes as you can. Point out a few places where they occur in the memoire.

2. A motif is a narrative element with symbolic meaning that repeats throughout a work of literature. Motifs may come in the form of recurring imagery, language, structure, or contrasts. It is more concrete than theme but relates to it. Discuss some motifs from Night, and explain how they relate to some of the themes.
